2014 HHMI Grants to Research Universities

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Summary

Through its 2014 *Sustaining Excellence* competition, HHMI is awarding new science education grants that will support activities at 37 research universities.

Howard Hughes Medical Institute (HHMI) has <u>awarded new grants</u> that will support activities at 37 research universities in the following thematic areas:

Student Learning and Faculty Development Communities

The development of learning communities will improve interactions between and among students and faculty, which will impact the institutional climate and culture. Activities include those designed to support (i) students in the areas of engagement, enthusiasm, math competency, foundational science, self-efficacy, and science identity, (ii) faculty in mentoring, advising, teaching, instruction, and collaborations, and (iii) student-faculty interactions, relationships, and perceptions. These activities support all student populations, especially introductory-level, non-traditional, transfer, at-risk and underrepresented students.

Introductory Course and Curriculum Development

HHMI grants will support major reform of introductory STEM courses (also known as gateway/gatekeeper courses). The changes impact instructional practices and pedagogy, and activities include providing active-learning and inquiry-based experiences to students, restructuring the curriculum for STEM degrees, measuring the effectiveness of student learning, and incorporating evidence-based teaching practices and educational research scholarship.

UT Austin will be expanding the program to accommodate transfer students.
